### **‘Ding’ film imagines world without fish**

The documentary film “The End of the Line: Where Have All the Fish Gone?” continues the fourth annual “Ding” Darling Wednesday Film Series on March 30, 2016, at 2:30 p.m. in the “Ding” Darling Visitor & Education Center auditorium.

Based on the critically acclaimed book by Charles Clover, “End of the Line” delves into the global overfishing crisis, particularly the imminent extinction of the bluefin tuna. Scientists discuss how this depletion has slipped under the public radar and how it affects the future of the oceans.

The award-winning, 83-minute documentary imagines a world without fish and promises to “change the way you think about seafood.”

“Ding” Darling Wildlife Society-Friends of the Refuge hosts the free eight-film, biweekly series with sponsorship from Sanibel-Captiva Beach Resorts. Seating is free, but limited and on a first-come basis.
