‘Ding’ Darling lecture lauds foresighted conservationists

In *Nature's Allies: Eight Conservationists Who Changed Our World*, author Larry Nielsen uses the stories of conservation pioneers to demonstrate that through passion and perseverance we can each be a positive force for change. On Friday, March 2, he will be presenting two free programs at 10 a.m. and 1 p.m., part of the 2018 “Ding” Darling Lecture Series at J.N. “Ding” Darling National Wildlife Refuge on Sanibel Island.

In the engaging and diverse biographies of John Muir, “Ding” Darling, Aldo Leopold, Rachel Carson, Chico Mendes, Billy Frank, Jr., Wangari Maathai, and Gro Harlem Brundtland, readers meet individuals who spoke out to protect wilderness, wildlife, fisheries, rainforests, and wetlands. They fought for social justice and exposed polluting practices. They marched, wrote books, testified before Congress, performed acts of civil disobedience, and, in one case, were martyred for their defense of nature.

Nielsen is professor of natural resources at North Carolina State University. He was president of the National Association of University Fisheries and Wildlife Programs from 1993 to 1995 and president of the American Fisheries Society from 1990 to 1991. He organized and co-chaired the First World Fisheries Congress, May 1992, in Athens, Greece. Nielsen was a Kellogg National Fellow (1981-1984) and is a Fellow of the American Institute of Fisheries Research Biologists and a Fellow and Honorary Member of the American Fisheries Society.

He will sign copies of his book, available in the Refuge Nature Store, following the two lectures. Proceeds from Nature Store sales directly benefit refuge wildlife, education, and research.

Seating for the lectures is limited and available on a first-come basis. Early arrivals can save one seat each and then may explore the Visitor & Education Center or Indigo Trail before the lecture starts. Saved seats must be filled 15 minutes before lecture time.

As usual, Wildlife Drive closes on Friday, but visitors are welcome to enjoy the free Visitor & Education Center, Indigo Trail, and recreational opportunities at Tarpon Bay Explorers, the refuge’s official recreation concession located at its Tarpon Bay Recreation Area.
