## 'Ding' to host celebrity birder Richard Crossley for opening of lecture series

As an internationally acclaimed birder, photographer, and prolific award-winning author of The Crossley ID Guide series, Richard Crossley is highly qualified to speak about "The Past, Present and Future of Conservation through Birding." That is the topic of his upcoming free lecture on Friday, Feb. 4, for the "Ding" Darling Wildlife Society-Friends of the Refuge. It will take place at The Community House at 2173 Periwinkle Way on Sanibel Island starting at 10 a.m.

Born in Yorkshire, England, Crossley also lived in Japan and birded worldwide before settling down in his current home in Cape May, N.J. Sometimes called crazy (his badge of honor), wildly passionate, and driven, Crossley's focus is youth birding and connecting people to a fuller appreciation and understanding of nature and its benefits to well-being.

One of Crossley's latest books, *Ornitherapy: For Your Mind, Body, and Soul* (co-authored with Sophie Crossley and Holly Merker – who speaks on Feb. 11) connects us all to nature with a stronger appreciation and understanding of our common ground and its many health benefits.

Crossley also co-founded the global birding initiatives Pledge to Fledge, Race4Birds, and the Cape May Young Birders Club. He served on the board of directors at Hawk Mountain Sanctuary and has contributed to most major birding publications. A highly sought-after speaker, he frequently also talks on radio shows.

The upcoming season's "Ding" Darling Lecture Series evolves with the times and persisting distance protocols by presenting at a larger off-refuge venue with seven scheduled lectures through March 25.

DDWS hosts the 18th annual lecture series, and HighTower/Thomas & Swartz Wealth Management and an anonymous donor sponsor Crossley's lecture.
